

PE and sport premium: 2020-2021

Introduction

The primary PE and sport premium 2020 to 2021 (“the premium”) will be paid by the Secretary of State for Education (“Secretary of State”) to the academies and free schools as stated in section 14 of the Education Act 2002.

Purpose of the premium

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2020 to 2021 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

- High quality PE provision in and out of curriculum time.

- Support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities.

- Encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support sport and physical activity within the school.
- [raise attainment in primary school swimming](#) to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of key stage 2.
- Embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching.
