<u>Teignmouth Community School – Mill Lane – COVID</u> <u>19 Behavior Policy Addendum – September 2021</u>

This addendum to the Behaviour Policy of Teignmouth Community School (Mill Lane) is for use during the education of pupils in school during Covid-19. It is to be used in conjunction with, and read alongside, the Behaviour Policy, Anti Bullying Policy and our Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy and Procedure. The addendum draws on existing statutory guidance and a number of additional COVID-19 documents published by the DfE.

In addition to our Green behaviors, which all children are expected and encouraged to demonstrate consistently, the following behaviors, as highlighted within the home school agreement, will also be expected, encouraged and celebrated:

Arrival/Departure:

• Children to arrive between 8.45-9am and sanitise their hands before following the allocated route to their classroom.

Hygiene:

- Children to follow school instruction on hygiene, including frequent and thorough hand washing and sanitising. Sanitiser stations will be set up around the school, including the entrance, playground and field.
- Children are to adopt the national 'catch it, bin it, kill it' process of dealing with sneezes and to cough into the crook of their arm. Posters will be put up around the school to remind children of this.

Consequences

If any of these behaviors are not met, the standard behavior policy will apply.

Serious Incidents

Additional examples to those already identified in the behaviour policy include:

Deliberate coughing, sneezing or spitting on somebody else.

As per the behaviour policy, continued unacceptable behaviour, intentional disregard for school rules or a serious incident may result in a fixed term exclusion. In this instance, a meeting will be called with the Headteacher or a member of the School Leadership Team. The class teacher will plan and set work to be completed during the absence.

- Children to follow school instruction on hygiene, including frequent and thorough hand washing and sanitising. Sanitiser stations will be set up around the school, including the playground and field.
- Children are to adopt the national 'catch it, bin it, kill it' process of dealing with sneezes and to cough into the crook of their arm. Posters will be put up around the school to remind children of this.
- Children to use provided equipment, keeping it at their own individual desk at all times, and not sharing with others, where possible. Children are not to bring any items in from home, especially toys, other than a labelled water bottle, packed lunch (if required) and a bag.

Consequences

If any of these behaviors are not met, the following consequence procedure will be followed: the standard behavior policy will apply.

- 1. Positive Reminder and reinforcement.
- 2. Positive Change
- 3. Reflection
- 4. Referral School Leader (children will be isolated in a well-ventilated room, with 2m social distancing)

If a pupil refuses to comply with consequences 1-3, then the incident may be escalated instantly to 'Referral – School Leader'.

Serious Incidents

Additional examples to those already identified in the behaviour policy include:

As per the behaviour policy, continued unacceptable behaviour, intentional disregard for school rules or a serious incident may result in a fixed term exclusion.
